FORENSIC NURSE EXAMINER—Durant Children's Center

Full time position, under the direction of the Director of Forensic Nursing, the FNE is responsible for responding to local hospital emergency departments in the Pee Dee Region to provide forensic examinations to acute cases adolescent sexual assault/abuse. Qualified Applicants must be a Registered Nurse licensed in SC with certification as FNE.

CAC Project Coordinator—Durant Children's Center

The Third Judicial Circuit Satellite CAC Project Coordinator is a key employee in helping facilitate the expansion of in-county services into the 3rd Judicial Circuit with a site in Sumter. The Coordinator will provide MDT Coordination, Training, Community Education and Direct Services. Qualified applicants must have a Bachelor's degree in Human Services or related field. Highly motivated and able to work independently. Knowledge of child abuse in general and specifically in MDT and CAC model.

FAMILY ADVOCATE—Durant Children's Center

The Family Advocate shall be responsible for the provision of advocacy services for children and adolescent victims of abuse and their families in the 3rd judicial circuit. Requirements: A Bachelor's Degree in Social Work, psychology or other human services related field. One year related experience and/or training; or equivalent combination of education and experience required. Knowledge of the SC Criminal Justice System, child development, the multidisciplinary process, and child abuse in general. Ability to work well with diverse populations and systems' personnel. Excellent written and verbal communication skills. Ability to manage time efficiently and effectively.

CAC Forensic Interviewer—Durant Children's Center

The CAC Forensic Interviewer will provide developmentally and culturally appropriate and legally defensible forensic interviews of children and adolescents involved in cases of alleged physical and sexual abuse. Assessments will be performed based on a multi-disciplinary service model combining clinical and forensic components. Master's degree and two years professional experience in a related field preferred. Certification and/or training in forensic interviewing through a nationally recognized and accepted organization. Position involves interviewing children and adolescents regarding allegations of abuse, working collaboratively with a multi-disciplinary team (i.e. law enforcement, CPS, medical staff, therapists, prosecution) and testifying in court as an expert witness pertaining to abuse and trauma. Timely, detailed, concise documentation required. Excellent written and oral communication and interpersonal skills required. Knowledge of the dynamics of child abuse and child development needed, as well as the ability to engage children of all ages in an interview type setting. Ability to cope in highly intense situation and conduct self in professional manner.

Clinical Director—Pee Dee Coalition

This is a 20 hour a week position responsible for the management of the clinical services provided by the counseling staff of Pee Dee Coalition. The Clinical Director provides vision and leadership to ensure quality service provision and coordination of services to adult and child victims and their families impacted by sexual violence, child abuse, dating violence, domestic/family violence, and human sex trafficking. Minimum qualifications: Master's Degree in Clinical Social Work, Psychology, Counseling or related field. Three years of supervisory experience. Experience working in a sexual assault or domestic violence program. Experience and knowledge of direct behavioral health services, including assessment, treatment and consultation. Experience in providing trauma-informed care. Certified in Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy.

Trauma Counselor/Advocate—Pee Dee Coalition

Pee Dee Coalition currently has 5 new positions for Trauma Counselor/Advocates in Bennettsville, Chesterfield, Darlington, Dillon and Wallace. The Trauma Counselor/Advocate shall be responsible for the provision of counseling services to victims of domestic and sexual violence and their families to include individual and support group counseling in the designated county site. The position of Trauma Counselor/Advocate requires a minimum of a Master's Degree, preferably in the field of Psychology or Social Work.
