Event Description:

Colleges and universities face significant challenges meeting the needs of those involved in and impacted by acts of sexual misconduct on campus. Restorative justice offers a framework for responding to harm that emphasizes relationships and repair over retribution and shame. Taking a restorative approach to gender-based misconduct allows institutions to promote healing and accountability and to prioritize rebuilding trust within communities.

Dr. Rachel King is a restorative justice practitioner specializing in issues of harassment and sexual misconduct in higher education. She has extensive experience facilitating restorative justice conferences in community and school-based programs and has held a number of roles in college administration, including Associate Dean of Students, Director of Community Standards and Conflict Resolution, and Title IX Coordinator. Rachel provides training to schools around the country on how to take a restorative approach to cases of sexual misconduct through the Department of Justice's Office on Violence Against Women campus grant program, and has been invited to speak by organizations including the National Organization on Victim Assistance (NOVA), It's On Us, and End Rape on Campus.
